1	"The rain gauge collected two inches of water," Noah reported (Patel 6).	EDITED	The comma is inside the quotation marks, and the period follows the parenthetical citation.
2	The historian states, "The bridge opened in 1924" (Reed 11).	EDITED	The sentence has correct capitalization, quotation marks, comma placement, citation placement, and end punctuation.
3	"How did the mapmaker measure the coast?" asks the article (James 3).	EDITED	The question mark belongs inside the quotation marks, and the citation follows the quotation.
4	In the journal, "rabbits hid beneath the brush" (Moore 8).	FIXING	The first word of the quoted sentence should begin with a capital letter.
5	The guide writes "The cave stays cool all year" (Allen 19).	FIXING	A comma is needed before the quoted words.
6	The text says, "A compass points north". (Green 27)	FIXING	The period should come after the parenthetical citation, not before it.
7	The coach says, "Practice builds confidence" (Wells 4).	EDITED	The comma, quotation marks, capitalization, citation, and final period are correctly placed.
8	The newspaper reports, "The parade begins at noon. (Baker 15)	FIXING	The closing quotation mark is missing before the citation.
