The Barn Owl's Hunt

- ① At dusk, a barn owl leaves its roost and glides over a grassy field. Its broad, pale wings beat slowly, then hold still as the bird listens. The owl's uneven ears help it notice tiny sounds from different directions. Beneath the grass, a vole rustles through dry stems. The owl tilts its round head, aims toward the faint noise, and drops with its talons stretched forward. In a few silent seconds, the hunt is over below.
- ② Barn owls do not rely on sharp eyesight alone. A soft fringe along each flight feather breaks up the air as the wings move. This feature helps the owl fly quietly, so a nearby vole may not hear danger. The bird's broad wings also let it drift slowly above the ground for long stretches. When the owl reaches its target, curved talons grip the animal firmly. It carries its meal back to a sheltered perch.
- ③ People can support barn owls by protecting the open places where they hunt. Farmers sometimes place nest boxes near fields, giving owls a safer spot to raise young. A box must be built carefully and placed where people will not disturb the birds. Protecting grasslands matters too, because voles and other small animals need cover and food there. When an owl swoops across a moonlit field, its quiet flight shows how several body features work together.
