Beavers at Work

- ① At sunset, a team of biologists walked beside a stream in northern Minnesota. They were checking on beavers that had been relocated, or moved from one habitat to another. The animals had built a lodge from branches and mud near the water. Because beavers are nocturnal, they rest mostly during daylight and become active after dark. The team saw fresh bark chips, a clue that the hidden animals had been busy. Their work could change the stream's flow and create new wetland areas.
- ② The next morning, the biologists examined a dam, a wall of sticks that slows water. Behind it, the stream had spread across a low field. This ponding can be beneficial, meaning helpful, because it gives frogs, ducks, and young fish places to feed or hide. However, water that spreads too far can flood a trail. To prevent that problem, workers installed a simple pipe through the dam. The pipe lets some water pass while leaving the beavers' home in place. This solution reduces conflict between people and wildlife.
- ③ Biologists will continue to monitor the site, or watch it carefully over time. They measure water depth, note animal tracks, and inspect the pipe after heavy rain. This regular monitoring helps them respond before a small concern becomes serious. Beaver projects are not identical everywhere. A dry year, a steep valley, or nearby roads can make results unpredictable, or hard to know in advance. By studying each location, scientists can choose plans that protect both the stream ecosystem and the people who use the land.

4	How do the prefix un- and the nearby clue help you understand unpredictable?	The prefix un- means not, so unpredictable means not able to be known ahead of time. The passage says "hard to know in advance."
