FIX IT, DO NOT TOSS IT!

- ① On Saturday, April 18, the Riverbend Library will host a free Repair Café from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Bring a lamp, a loose chair leg, or a backpack with a broken zipper. Volunteers will bring tools and basic supplies. Last spring, 86 visitors carried repaired items home instead of sending them to the landfill. Meet us in the library's Community Room, beside the garden entrance with your family.
- ② “I thought my backpack was finished,” said eighth grader Maya Ortiz, “but a volunteer showed me how to replace one zipper pull.” Her family donated \$5 to the library after the visit, although no payment is required. Repairing small problems can save money and keep useful materials in use longer. If you cannot bring an item, stop by to watch a demonstration at 11:30. You may learn how to tighten a screw, sew a button, or decide when an item needs professional repair.
- ③ **HOW TO JOIN:** First, choose one item that is safe to carry. Next, write a short note explaining what is wrong. Then arrive before 12:30 so volunteers have time to inspect it. Adults must stay with children under 12. Questions? Call 555-0148 or ask at the library desk. A repaired object may still need care, but one careful fix can give it a useful next chapter for someone else to enjoy at home later.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

SHARE MORE, WASTE LESS! Bring clean school supplies to the cafeteria on Thursday from 3:15 to 4:00. "I found a notebook I can use for science," said sixth grader Eli. First, place your extra pencils, folders, or paper on a table. Next, choose supplies you need. Families may take part after school, too. What could you help another student use?
