The Garden Podcast Team

- ① Ms. Lee's sixth-grade class planned a three-minute podcast about the school garden. Before anyone researched, the team met to make group norms. They agreed to listen without interrupting, respond to ideas respectfully, and ask before changing another person's work. They also chose a shared goal: teach younger students how the garden provides food and habitat. Maya wrote the agreements in a shared document, and every member typed initials beside them. This gave the team a clear promise to use during the project.
- ② Next, the group set procedures for the work. On Monday, Omar would collect facts from the garden manager, while Priya would find photographs that could be described in the audio. On Tuesday, they would meet for ten minutes to compare sources and place their notes in labeled folders. Each person would write one section of the script by Thursday. If a member could not finish a task, that person would post a message by the day before the deadline so the group could adjust. These steps clarified each task and deadline.
- ③ During the first script meeting, two members wanted to use the same opening fact. Instead of arguing, they returned to their norm of listening and gave each person one minute to explain. The group selected the fact that matched the podcast goal, then recorded the choice in the shared document. Jordan noticed that the photo descriptions were missing, so he asked Priya what support she needed. Omar offered to help after his research was complete. At the next check-in, the team reviewed progress, solved one problem, and updated its task list.
