The Cafeteria Podcast

- ① On Monday, six students in Ms. Chen's class began a project to create a lunchtime podcast about reducing cafeteria waste. First, they agreed on a shared goal: teach students one action they could take during lunch. The group listed tasks on a chart. Aaliyah would interview the cafeteria manager, Mateo would gather facts about sorting trash, Priya would write questions, and Owen and Lila would record and edit the audio. Jordan would check the schedule and keep the team on time.
- ② During their first meeting, Mateo wanted to focus only on plastic forks, but Aaliyah said many students also threw away unopened food. Instead of choosing quickly, Jordan asked each person to explain what evidence they had. The team decided to include both topics in one short episode. Priya revised her questions after hearing Aaliyah's interview plan. When Owen noticed that recording time was limited, Lila suggested making a two-minute outline before they used the microphone. Everyone agreed, and Jordan added the new deadline to the chart.
- ③ On Friday, the group listened to the finished podcast together. Owen thought the ending needed a clearer action step, while Priya believed it was already complete. They played the last twenty seconds twice and compared it with their shared goal. Then they added one sentence asking listeners to choose reusable utensils when possible. Aaliyah checked that the sentence matched the interview facts, and Mateo made sure it fit the time limit. By reviewing the work, listening to different views, and adjusting one part, the team completed a project they all supported.
