My Reading and Writing Choices

- ① When I choose a book for independent reading, I usually reach for realistic fiction or mystery. I like stories about middle school because the problems feel possible, even when the characters make choices I would not make. Mystery adds a question that pulls me forward. I pay attention to clues, suspects, and surprising turns. Long descriptions of a setting can slow me down, but short chapters and dialogue help me picture the action. I often read a few extra pages because I want to test my guess about the ending.
- ② For school research, I prefer articles, interviews, and charts to a textbook chapter alone. An article with headings lets me locate one idea at a time. Interviews show a person's exact words, so I can notice a point of view. Charts help me compare numbers quickly, although I still read the labels. When I write an explanation, I start with a claim and organize my ideas in sections with headings. I use facts from sources, then explain how each fact supports my claim. This structure keeps my writing from becoming a list of unconnected details.
- ③ Outside school, I enjoy writing short fantasy scenes in a notebook. I choose this mode because I can invent a place, a rule, and a problem without explaining every detail first. My favorite technique is using sensory details, such as the smell of rain on stone, to make an imaginary place feel real. I also like ending a scene with a small unanswered question. Poetry is harder for me because I spend too long trying to make every line rhyme. Before I share a draft, I ask a friend whether the setting is easy to picture.
