### Malik Makes a Plan

- ① On Tuesday, Malik carried a mystery novel to the bus, but after three pages he felt lost. Instead of deciding that he was “bad at reading,” he paused. He reread the page, noticed several unfamiliar words, and used the sentence clues to figure out one of them. Then he wrote two questions on a sticky note: Who sent the letter? Why is the attic locked? By the time the bus reached school, Malik wanted to read the next chapter.
- ② Later, Malik began a short story about a girl who repairs old radios. His first opening explained every detail, so he read it aloud and decided it sounded slow. He crossed out two sentences and started with a radio crackling during a storm. When he needed a detail about radio parts, he checked a library book instead of guessing. Malik asked his cousin to read the new opening, but he chose which suggestion to use. He kept a note about his next revision.
- ③ By Friday, Malik had a plan for his independent reading time. He would try twenty pages of the mystery novel, then decide whether its questions still interested him. If he became confused, he would reread a short section before asking for help. He also listed a realistic writing goal: add one scene to his radio story. His plan did not promise perfect work. It gave him steps for making choices, using resources, and changing direction when needed.
