Nia's Text Toolkit

- ① On Tuesday, Nia entered the school library looking for a book about skateboarding. The catalog search gave her several titles, but she also asked the librarian which authors wrote from a skater's point of view. Nia opened two books, read the first pages, and checked the back-cover summaries. She chose one memoir and wrote its title in a note on her phone. Her list helped her remember books she might read later or recommend to a friend.
- ② While reading, Nia did more than finish pages. She placed a question mark beside a confusing sentence and used a dictionary app to check an unfamiliar word. At home, she watched a short interview with the memoir's author and compared the interview with the book. When Nia disagreed with one claim, she wrote a note explaining why. These moves made her an active consumer of texts because she questioned, checked, and connected ideas instead of accepting every statement immediately.
- ③ Reading also gave Nia ideas for her own writing. She noticed that the memoir began with a quick scene at a skate park, so she tried opening her blog post with a scene from her bus ride. Before publishing, she used a planning page, a spell-check tool, and comments from her cousin. She revised one unclear paragraph after her cousin asked a question. By choosing tools and sharing her post, Nia acted as a producer who shaped a text for real readers.
