A Better Water Choice

- ① Our school cafeteria sells bottled water, but many students also bring reusable bottles. At lunch, the only water fountain near the cafeteria has a low spout, so students often wait in line or choose a sugary drink instead. The student council is asking the principal to consider a bottle-filling station beside the cafeteria. This station would quickly fill reusable bottles with drinking water. The proposal is not about banning drinks. It is about giving students an easier water choice during a busy part of the day.
- ② A bottle-filling station could help the school solve several daily problems. First, it could shorten lines because its nozzle is designed to fill a bottle faster than a standard fountain spout. Second, students who forget water in the morning could refill a clean bottle instead of buying a drink. Reusable bottles may also reduce the number of single-use plastic bottles placed in cafeteria trash cans. The station would need regular cleaning and filter checks, just like other drinking fountains. Planning for that care would help keep the water available and safe.
- ③ Some people may worry that a new station costs money. The principal can compare prices, ask the district facilities team about installation, and decide whether funds are available. Students can help by sharing how often they would use the station and by showing where lunchtime lines form. For these reasons, the student council recommends adding one bottle-filling station for a trial period. The principal should review the information this month and decide whether to include the station in the next school improvement plan. A trial would give the school useful evidence before any larger purchase.

2	Name one reason the writer gives for adding the station. What detail from the passage supports that reason?	One reason is that it could shorten lunch lines. The passage explains that its nozzle fills a bottle faster than a standard fountain spout.
3	What concern might a reader have about the proposal? How does the writer suggest handling that concern?	A reader may worry about cost. The writer suggests comparing prices, asking the facilities team about installation, and checking whether funds are available.
4	What information can students provide to help the principal make a decision? Explain how that information could help.	Students can share how often they would use the station and show where lunch lines form. This information shows whether students need and would use the station.
