### Puzzle Swap at the Library

- ① Hello, Ridgeview students. I am Ms. Alvarez, the school librarian, and I am writing in the Monday bulletin because our library will hold a Puzzle Swap during lunch on April 18. Many students enjoy puzzles but leave unfinished boxes at home after losing a few pieces. Bring a puzzle that has all its pieces, and choose another one to take home. This event gives puzzles a new life and helps classmates find a fresh challenge without buying one.
- ② To make the swap fair, place your puzzle in a bag or box with the number of pieces written on it. At the library table, a student helper will check that the box is complete before you receive a swap ticket. You may use one ticket to select one puzzle. Do not bring puzzles with missing pieces, torn boxes, or pictures that might upset younger students. If you do not have a puzzle to trade, you may still visit the table and see how the swap works.
- ③ Your visit can help the library plan future activities. After the swap, scan the QR code on the table and answer three short questions about the puzzles you saw. Your ideas will help us decide whether to hold another swap, add a puzzle shelf, or try a different lunch event. The bulletin includes the date, place, rules, and feedback step so students can decide quickly whether to join. I hope you will bring a complete puzzle or stop by to learn more.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

Ridgeview students, I am Mr. Patel, the family liaison, and I am collecting clean, gently used winter coats for the neighborhood cold-weather drive through November 8. Put coats in the labeled bin outside the main office so local families can receive warm clothing before colder days arrive.
