Riverbank Cleanup Crew

- ① Want to make a muddy creek cleaner before summer? Join the Riverbank Cleanup Crew this Saturday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. at Maple Park. Students in grades 6 through 8 can collect litter, sort recyclables, and help protect frogs, fish, and birds. Meet by the picnic shelter, where the park ranger will hand out gloves, bags, and safety vests. Bring a filled water bottle and wear shoes that can get dirty. A parent or guardian must sign the permission slip.
- ② You may notice trash along the path, but your work will have a clear result. When rain falls, loose wrappers and bottles can wash into the creek. Removing them helps keep the water safer for animals and for people who visit the park. You do not need special experience to help. Crew leaders will show you how to use grabbers, avoid sharp objects, and separate cans from other trash. Work with a partner so the job stays safe and organized.
- ③ Bring your curiosity, and bring a friend from school. The cleanup is a chance to spend a morning outdoors while making a shared space look better. At 10:45, volunteers will count the bags they filled and record the kinds of litter they found. Those notes will help the park staff decide where to place more bins. Sign up on the sheet outside the main office by Thursday afternoon. Your name on the list helps leaders prepare enough supplies for everyone.

1	Who is the most likely audience for this notice? Give one detail from the passage that supports your answer.	The audience is students in grades 6 through 8. The notice directly says, "Students in grades 6 through 8 can collect litter."
2	What is the author's main purpose?	The author wants students to join and sign up for the Riverbank Cleanup Crew.
3	Paragraph 2 says, "You do not need special experience to help." What concern might this address, and how does it fit the audience?	It addresses a student's worry about lacking skills. It reassures young or new volunteers that they can participate.
4	Why does the author include the meeting place, supply details, and sign-up deadline?	These details tell students exactly how to take part and make joining the cleanup feel organized and manageable.
