### A River Changes Course

- ① Along the Cuyahoga River in Ohio, decades of industrial waste and sewage damaged the water. By the 1960s, oil and chemicals sometimes floated on the river's surface. In 1969, pollution on the river caught fire, drawing national attention. Fish populations had fallen, and many people avoided the riverbanks. The fire was not the only reason for change, but it became a powerful image of the river's poor condition. Factories and cities upstream released much of the pollution before stronger environmental rules existed.
- ② After the fire, local groups, businesses, and governments began working to clean the river. The federal Clean Water Act of 1972 set rules for pollution released into waterways. Cities improved sewage-treatment systems, and industries changed some waste-disposal practices. Volunteers also removed trash from riverbanks and planted native vegetation. These efforts took years, and cleanup projects continued in different parts of the watershed. Scientists tested the water and tracked which fish and insects returned over time.
- ③ Today, parts of the Cuyahoga support fish, birds, and people who paddle or walk beside the water. Water quality has improved, although challenges remain after heavy rain and in some polluted areas. In 2019, the river was named an American River of the Year by the nonprofit American Rivers. The river's history is often used when communities discuss how laws, public action, and long-term monitoring can change a damaged waterway over several decades for future users.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

In the 1970s, bald eagles had become rare in much of the lower 48 United States. The pesticide DDT built up in food chains and caused eagle eggshells to become thin. Habitat loss also made nesting more difficult. In 1972, the United States banned most uses of DDT. Wildlife agencies protected nesting areas, and the Endangered Species Act helped protect bald eagles in many states. Biologists also monitored eagle nests and counted young birds. Bald eagle numbers rose over time, and the species was removed from the federal endangered species list in 2007. Eagles still face dangers, including lead poisoning and habitat loss. Their recovery shows how laws, habitat protection, and monitoring can work together.
