CLEAR MODIFIER

A descriptive phrase sits next to the word it describes.
The reader can tell exactly who or what the phrase describes.

UNCLEAR MODIFIER

A descriptive phrase has no clear word to describe, or it seems to describe the wrong word. This can make the sentence confusing or silly.

Using a flashlight, the cave appeared enormous.

1	The librarian shelved the books that had torn covers.	CLEAR	The phrase "that had torn covers" clearly describes the books.
2	After finishing the experiment, Maya washed the beakers.	CLEAR	Maya is the person who finished the experiment.
3	Walking through the hallway, the posters caught Jordan's attention.	UNCLEAR	The posters cannot walk through the hallway, so the opening phrase dangles.
4	The cyclist wearing a blue helmet crossed the bridge.	CLEAR	The phrase "wearing a blue helmet" clearly describes the cyclist.
5	The chef placed the steaming soup on the table.	CLEAR	The word "steaming" clearly describes the soup.
6	The student who found the missing key called the office.	CLEAR	The phrase "who found the missing key" clearly describes the student.
7	The waiter served the soup to the guests in bowls.	UNCLEAR	The phrase "in bowls" appears to describe the guests instead of the soup.
8	To reach the campsite before dark, the trail had to be followed quickly.	UNCLEAR	A trail cannot try to reach a campsite, so the opening phrase dangles.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **CLEAR:** The actor carrying a lantern entered the theater.
- **UNCLEAR:** Racing to the bus stop, the backpack fell from Elena's shoulder.

Challenge: After practicing all week, Devon lifted the trophy. The opening phrase describes Devon.

For Part 2, students should identify the word described in a CLEAR sentence or explain the misplaced or dangling phrase in an UNCLEAR sentence. Part 3 and challenge responses may vary if the modifier relationship is clear and correct.
