A Turtle's Night Journey

- ① At dawn, a green sea turtle lifted its broad head above the warm Atlantic water near Florida's coast. The turtle did not hurry. It paddled steadily through rolling waves, searching for a quiet stretch of sand. On shore, moonlight still silvered the beach, while small crabs scuttled sideways near the dune grass. The turtle's journey had begun far offshore, but its final task required a safe, dry place beyond the reach of high tides each year.
- ② Using its rear flippers, the turtle scraped a shallow chamber in the sand. Then it released about one hundred round eggs into the nest and covered them with loose grains. This careful work protected the eggs from bright sunlight and hungry animals. Afterward, the exhausted turtle pressed the sand firmly with its body, turned slowly toward the water, and disappeared into the dark surf. Several weeks later, tiny hatchlings will push upward and race quickly toward the sea.
- ③ Scientists and volunteers watch turtle nests because changing beaches can affect hatchling survival. A powerful storm may wash away sand, and artificial lights can pull hatchlings inland instead of seaward. Teams place simple barriers around some nests and ask visitors to keep beaches dark at night. These actions cannot remove every danger, yet they give more hatchlings a chance to reach the ocean safely after leaving their nests and begin their long lives in the wild.
