One Bus Stop, Different Texts

- ① When the city opened a solar-powered bus stop near Lincoln Middle School, a local newspaper reported the event. The news article named the location, opening date, cost, and number of charging ports. It quoted a transit official and explained which routes would use the stop. The reporter focused on verified details that affected riders. It did not invent anyone's private thoughts or add a surprise ending, because readers needed clear information about a public change.
- ② In a personal essay about the same bus stop, a seventh grader described waiting in the rain with her trumpet case and watching the first bus arrive. She explained that the roof made her feel safer during storms. Her memories and opinions helped readers understand why the change mattered to one person. The essay might mention the opening day, but it would not need the project's full cost or every route. Its purpose was to share an individual experience, not provide a complete public report.
- ③ A mystery story could use the bus stop as a setting, but it would include different ideas. A character might notice a locked panel, a missing key card, and muddy footprints near the chargers. These clues would create questions about who entered the stop after dark. The writer could hide some information until the final scene, when the character solves the problem. Exact construction costs and route schedules would matter only if they helped the plot. The story's goal would be suspense, not a full explanation of the transit project.

News report: event date and time; number of projects displayed; names of the judges. A news report gives readers public facts, while a personal essay shares one person's experience and feelings.
