The Pollinator Guide Team

- ① At the first meeting of the Riverdale Middle School pollinator-guide team, Maya asked everyone to help set a goal. The group decided to create a four-page guide that teaches younger students how to spot three local pollinators by Friday, May 10. Before choosing jobs, they agreed on norms: listen without interrupting, question ideas respectfully, and bring needed materials. They also chose a procedure for decisions. After a short discussion, the team would vote if they could not reach agreement. Jordan recorded the norms and goal in a shared document.
- ② Next, the team turned its goal into steps. Lina would research pollinators using library books and a state wildlife website. Devon would sketch page layouts, while Maya would write captions from Lina's notes. Each person would add work to the shared folder by 4:00 on Tuesday. On Wednesday, they would meet for fifteen minutes to check progress against a checklist. If someone needed help, that person would post a question in the group chat before the meeting. These procedures made deadlines, materials, and requests clear.
- ③ During the Wednesday check-in, Devon said the layouts were late because he could not find the required photos. Instead of blaming him, Jordan restated the norm about respectful questions and asked what support would help. Lina offered links to copyright-free images, and Maya agreed to review the captions one day later so Devon had time to finish. The team changed its checklist and recorded the new due date. By discussing the problem calmly, using their procedures, and adjusting the plan together, the team protected both its goal and its working relationships.

Goal: By April 18, create a six-slide presentation that explains three ways to save water at school. Norms: Let each speaker finish, disagree with evidence, and complete promised work. Procedures: Assign slide owners on Monday, upload sources by Thursday, and hold a ten-minute checklist meeting each Friday. If a member falls behind, ask privately what support is needed, redistribute one task if necessary, and set a new due date together.
