A Rain Garden Proposal

- ① During science night, Maya presented a plan for a rain garden beside the school parking lot. She explained that a shallow planted area can catch storm water and let some soak into the ground. Then she paused and said, “What questions do you have about the plan?” Jordan raised his hand. “Would the garden flood after a heavy storm?” Maya answered, “It is designed to hold water for a short time, but an overflow pipe can carry extra water away.”
- ② Another audience member, Elena, asked, “How would this change our school?” Maya replied, “The plants could make the area cooler and provide habitat for insects and birds.” Elena followed up: “Who would take care of the plants during summer?” Maya did not guess. She said, “I need to check with the grounds team before I can answer that accurately.” She wrote Elena’s question on her note card and added, “Does anyone know what summer care a rain garden needs?”
- ③ Mr. Chen asked, “How much would the rain garden cost?” Maya answered, “Our class has not chosen a final design, so I cannot give a reliable total yet.” She continued, “Would you like to see the cost estimates we compare next week?” Mr. Chen said yes. At the end, Maya thanked the audience and reviewed the questions she still needed to research. She planned to email answers about plant care, overflow pipes, and costs before the next meeting.

1	How did Maya respond to Jordan's question about flooding?	She said the garden would hold water briefly, and an overflow pipe could carry extra water away.
2	Why did Maya not answer Elena's question about summer plant care right away?	She needed to check with the grounds team before she could answer accurately.
3	What question did Maya ask after Elena's summer-care question, and how did it continue the dialogue?	She asked whether anyone knew what summer care a rain garden needs. This invited audience members to share information.
4	How did Maya respond to Mr. Chen's cost question while keeping the conversation open?	She said she could not give a reliable total without a final design and offered to show cost estimates the next week.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Audience: "Where would you place a bike rack?" Me: "I would place it near the library entrance, where riders can lock bikes close to the main walkway." Audience: "How many bikes would it hold?" Me: "I need to check the available space before I can give an exact number, but what rack size would be most useful to students?"

Accept responses that identify Maya's accurate answers, her honest limits, and her follow-up questions or invitations. For Part 3, accept any four-turn dialogue that includes two audience questions, a detailed answer, an honest response to uncertainty, and a question that continues discussion.
