Maya Chooses a Source

- ① During a science unit on watersheds, Maya needed a grade-level text for a short research project. She first noticed a magazine article called "The River Beneath the Street" because she rides her bike past storm drains after rain. The article explained how paved surfaces send water and pollutants into streams. Its headings, map, and 900-word length made it manageable, but Maya did not choose it yet. She wanted to see whether another text connected more closely to the project question about protecting local water.
- ② At the library, she found a book chapter, "Beavers, Dams, and Healthy Streams." Maya had watched beavers near her aunt's cabin, so the topic interested her. More important, the chapter described how dams slow water, create ponds, and affect other living things. A diagram showed changes in a stream habitat, and a glossary explained words such as sediment. Maya checked the publication date and found that the book was published by a university press in 2023. These features made it useful for her research.
- ③ Maya selected the beaver chapter. It matched the class topic because it gave evidence about how one animal can change a watershed. It also held her interest because she could connect the information to a place she knew. Before reading, Maya wrote two questions in her notebook: How can a beaver dam reduce erosion? When might a dam cause problems for people? Her choice was not based only on liking beavers. She chose a text that could help her investigate a school topic.
