Nia Plans a Proposal

- ① Before writing a proposal about adding a water-refill station near the gym, Nia paused to plan. Her purpose was to persuade the school wellness committee to consider the idea. She wanted readers to understand that students often finish practice thirsty and that refill stations can reduce single-use plastic bottles. Nia chose the committee as her target audience because its members help recommend campus improvements. She also set a goal: ask the committee to place the proposal on its next meeting agenda.
- ② Because committee members may have limited time, Nia planned a clear, respectful message. She would begin with a brief description of the problem, then include observations from students leaving afternoon practices. Next, she would explain how a refill station could help and give an estimated cost from a supplier's public catalog. Her second goal was to support each claim with useful evidence, not just opinions. She decided not to fill the proposal with sports slang, since some committee members do not coach teams.
- ③ At the end, Nia planned to request a specific next step rather than simply announce her opinion. She would ask the wellness committee to review the proposal and decide whether to seek funding. This goal shaped her final paragraph, which would restate the benefit to students and invite questions about cost or maintenance. Nia knew a different audience, such as her classmates, might need a different purpose and tone. For classmates, she might aim to gather ideas, use more familiar language, and ask them to complete a short survey.
