Accept any explanation that names the deciding feature from the rule box for the chosen item.

## PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **CORRECT:** The canoe -- bright red and slightly worn -- drifted beside the dock.
- **INCORRECT:** The baker -- mixed the dough.

**Challenge:** The baker mixed the dough -- the oven suddenly stopped working. The dash now separates two complete thoughts and shows an abrupt turn.

In Part 2, accept explanations that identify extra information, an interruption, or sentence parts incorrectly split by a dash. For Part 3, check that the CORRECT sentence uses a dash appropriately and the INCORRECT sentence clearly misuses one.
