AUTHOR AND PAGE

Use the author's last name and page number in parentheses when the sentence does not name the author. Put the period after the closing parenthesis.

PAGE ONLY

Use only the page number in parentheses when the sentence already names the author. Put the period after the closing parenthesis.

Osei links the small crop to a late frost (14).

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **AUTHOR:** The museum opened a gallery for local artists (Price 8).
- **PAGE:** Price notes that the gallery features local artists (8).

Challenge: Chen explains that the city's trees cool nearby sidewalks (33). The trees also provide shade for people waiting at bus stops (Chen 33).

For Part 2, students should identify whether the author's last name appears in each sentence and connect that detail to the citation form. Accept original Part 3 and challenge responses that use correct MLA parenthetical citation placement and forms.
