## CONSISTENT TENSE

The verbs show actions in the same time frame. A sentence can use past tense throughout or present tense throughout.

The violinist tuned her instrument before the concert began.

## SHIFTED TENSE

The verbs switch time frames without a reason. One verb may be past tense while another verb in the same situation is present tense.

The astronaut entered the capsule as she checks the controls.

| 3 | When the gate opens, the crowd cheered.                                            | <b>SHIFTED</b>    | Opens is present tense, but cheered is past tense.  |

## PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **CONSISTENT:** The gardener pulled weeds and watered the beans.
- **SHIFTED:** The pilot checked the map, then she chooses a route.

**Challenge:** After the fog lifted, the sailors checked the compass, and they steered the boat toward shore.

For Part 2, students should name the relevant verbs and explain whether the verbs remain in one time frame or shift. In the challenge, accept varied verb tenses as long as all verbs consistently match and the sentence is compound-complex.
