A Mountain Backup

- ① High on a mountain on the Norwegian island of Spitsbergen, the Svalbard Global Seed Vault protects backup seeds from farms around the world. Its remote location offers natural shelter, and the surrounding permafrost helps keep the rooms cold. Workers do not grow crops there. Instead, they store small packets that other seed banks send. Each packet carries a label, so future scientists can identify the plant, its origin, and the year the seeds entered the vault.
- ② Inside the vault, the packets rest on metal shelves behind locked doors. The vault serves as a reserve for collections held elsewhere, not as a place where visitors borrow seeds. When a participating seed bank loses a crop variety because of war, disaster, or equipment failure, it may request its own duplicate packets. Staff members then remove the requested packets and ship them back. This careful system gives communities another chance to rebuild a damaged collection.
- ③ Although the vault lies deep inside a mountain, people still monitor its conditions. Sensors record temperature and humidity, while workers inspect the building during visits. The cold environment slows the aging of most seeds, but it does not stop time completely. Seed banks must replace old samples with fresh ones before too many seeds lose the ability to grow. By preserving many varieties, the vault can support food supplies that may need to adapt to future changes in climate or disease.
