Marsh Repair Report

- ① At dawn, volunteers gathered beside the Willow Creek marsh with gloves, trowels, and native sedge plants. They did not simply place greenery along the bank. Instead, they pressed each young plant into damp soil and packed the roots firmly. The narrow leaves will help hold loose ground during heavy rain. Near the water, students carefully removed a thick mat of invasive water hyacinth, a floating plant that can block sunlight from reaching plants below in the mud.
- ② By midmorning, the crew had cleared a small channel where rainwater had stalled. Maya recorded the work in a field notebook. Rather than writing, “We fixed the area,” she wrote, “We widened the clogged channel by two meters.” Her revised sentence names the action, identifies the problem, and gives a measured result. Clear verbs, specific nouns, and exact phrases help readers picture what happened without guessing about the work completed by the volunteers that morning.
- ③ In the afternoon, a sudden breeze carried plastic wrappers toward the restored bank. Luis quickly collected the light trash before it reached the channel. Then the group sorted reusable tools from broken supplies and stored the tools in a dry shed. Their supervisor praised the team for responding promptly, but she also noted that careful planning would reduce future litter. The project showed that a healthier marsh depends on steady work, accurate observations, and responsible choices.
