Mail Beneath the Streets

- ① Before electronic messages, several large cities used pneumatic tube systems to move mail quickly. In these networks, air pressure pushed small capsules through subterranean pipes, or pipes below the ground. New York City began using postal tubes in 1897. The capsules carried letters between post offices, avoiding crowded streets above. Today, remnants of some tube routes can still be found, but most of the systems became obsolete when trucks, telephones, and other technologies changed communication.
- ② Running a tube network required a meticulous schedule. Workers sorted mail into capsules, checked the machinery, and recorded each delivery. If a capsule stopped, technicians located the blockage before sending another one. The work was not always simple. A label on an old capsule might be provisional, especially when its destination or date was unclear. Historians compare such labels with maps, newspapers, and postal records. This evidence can replace an early guess with a more reliable identification.
- ③ In 1913, the New York system carried millions of pieces of mail each year, showing why the technology seemed efficient in its era. Yet the equipment was expensive to maintain, and its routes could not reach every address. The postal tube service in New York ended in 1953. Museums and archives preserve photographs, capsules, and diagrams from these networks. These objects make an overlooked part of city infrastructure accessible to people studying how communication has changed.
