Building a Pollinator Garden

- ① When the eighth-grade service club decided to build a pollinator garden beside the library, the members began with a shared goal: create a space that supports local insects and teaches younger students. At their first meeting, Maya suggested a four-week schedule. Jordan listed needed materials, while Priya contacted the city garden center about native plants. The group agreed that every decision would be recorded in one online document so absent members could check progress and add ideas.
- ② During the second week, the club faced a problem. The garden center could not donate enough mulch, and two students had missed the planning meeting. Instead of assigning blame, Maya posted the updated supply list and asked the absent students which tasks they could complete. Jordan proposed collecting fallen leaves for a leaf-mulch layer, and the group compared that idea with buying mulch. After checking the budget and the science teacher's advice, they chose the leaf-mulch plan and divided the work into pairs.
- ③ On planting day, each pair checked its assigned task against the online document. Priya's pair placed plant labels, Jordan's pair spread leaf mulch, and Maya's pair photographed the work for a slideshow. When rain began early, the team moved the labels and camera indoors, then finished the planting after the weather cleared. At the final meeting, students reviewed the schedule, noted that pairs had finished on time, and thanked one another for sharing information, solving the mulch problem, and adjusting plans.

4	How did the team adjust when rain began, and how did that help the project continue?	They moved the labels and camera indoors, then finished planting after the weather cleared.
