Peregrine Falcons in Cities

- ① Peregrine falcons are among the worlds fastest birds. During a hunting dive, called a stoop, they can exceed 200 miles per hour. Their pointed wings and strong feet help them catch other birds in midair. By the mid-1900s, some populations had become rare because of DDT, a pesticide that weakened eggshells. After DDT was banned in the United States in 1972, recovery programs helped many falcons return to places where they had disappeared for decades.
- ② Cities can now provide surprising falcon habitat. Tall buildings resemble cliffs, and ledges offer sheltered places for nests. A pair may raise chicks on a bridge or office tower, while hunting pigeons and other prey nearby. Volunteers often watch nest sites, they record when eggs hatch and when young birds leave the nest. This information helps scientists learn whether a local population is growing over several breeding seasons, an important measure of success for conservation.
- ③ City residents can support falcons without approaching a nest. A falcons nest needs space, especially during the breeding season. If you see a young falcon on the ground keep people and pets away and call a licensed wildlife rehabilitator or local animal agency. Young birds sometimes leave the nest before they can fly well, so a nearby adult may still be caring for them. Never feed a falcon because human food can harm it and close contact can make the bird less wary of people.
