MATCHING STRUCTURE

The parts of a list use the same grammatical form, such as all infinitive verbs, all -ing verbs, or all noun phrases. This matching structure connects equal ideas.

Lanterns flickered, shadows shifted, raindrops glittered.

MIXED STRUCTURE

The parts of a list change grammatical form, such as moving from an -ing verb to an infinitive verb. This uneven pattern can make equal ideas sound unbalanced.

Her hobbies include sailing, to build models, and chess.
