GREEK-BUILT WORDS

These words are built mainly from Greek roots or affixes. Use the Greek parts to infer a meaning.

Telegraph: Greek tele means far and graph means write, pointing to a system that sends written messages far away.

LATIN-BUILT WORDS

These words are built mainly from Latin roots or affixes. Use the Latin parts to infer a meaning.

Submarine: Latin sub means under and marin means sea, pointing to a vessel that travels under the sea.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **GREEK:** Biography combines bio, life, and graph, write, so it means a written account of a life.
- **LATIN:** Retract combines re, back, and tract, pull, so it means pull back or take back.

Challenge: Television combines Greek tele, far, with Latin vision, seeing. It means seeing images from far away.

Accept accurate root or affix evidence that connects to the word's meaning. For Part 2, students may explain the parts in their own words as long as the language origin and inferred meaning are correct.
