Building a Reading Path

- ① When Ms. Chen assigned a research project on how public spaces shape community life, Amara did not begin with a random web search. She thought about places she uses after school. Her neighborhood has a small library, a busy bus stop, and a basketball court with no shade. Because she enjoys drawing building plans, she wanted to investigate how designers make outdoor spaces comfortable. Her first choice was an article from a city planning magazine about tree shade, benches, and walking routes. It matched her interest in design and gave her a possible focus for the assignment.
- ② Next, Amara read a report from her city's parks department. The report listed temperatures measured on paved and tree-covered areas during summer afternoons and described a plan to add trees near playgrounds. This source was more technical than the magazine article, but it supplied evidence she could use in her project. She also checked the report's date, author, and links to the measurement methods. Those features helped her decide that the information was reliable enough for school research. Although she liked a social media video about colorful park murals, she set it aside because it did not explain comfort or heat.
- ③ After reading both sources, Amara narrowed her question to this: How could shade improve the basketball court near her bus stop? She wrote a claim that the court should have trees or a shade structure, then planned to use the parks report for measured temperature evidence. The planning article helped her describe design choices, such as where benches and paths could go. Amara knew she still needed another perspective, so she chose to interview players or read a local news article about park funding. Her reading choices were not identical, but each one had a clear job in her writing.
