HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that a written word is made of letters lined up together. Model with the different word "bed" by pointing to its letters as you say them, then read the scripts and let students mark their own pages.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • FIND A LETTER

SAY "Each row begins with a word. I will read the word and the letters. Can you circle the letter each question asks for?"

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The first box says map. The other letters are r, a, and s. Which letter is in map? Circle it.	a
b	The first box says sun. The other letters are n, t, and p. Which letter ends sun? Circle it.	n
c	The first box says pig. The other letters are g, m, and s. Which letter ends pig? Circle it.	g

PART 2 • WRITE A LETTER

SAY "Each word is beside an empty box. Look at the first letter in each word. Can you write that letter in its box?"

- Box 1 (beside cat): **c**
- Box 2 (beside log): **l**
- Box 3 (beside hat): **h**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle answers are a, n, and g. Writing answers are c, l, and h, and accept recognizable uppercase forms of these letters.
