HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each sentence slowly, then repeat the choices as needed. Students listen for whether the subject names one or more and choose an action word that matches. For example, one kite flies, while two kites fly.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Each row has action words. I will read a sentence with a missing action word and read the choices. Which word makes the sentence sound right?”
