HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read every choice aloud because students may not read the printed words yet. This sheet checks whether children can choose and connect a polite word, a school word, and a science word in spoken situations.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • PICK A WORD

SAY “For each row, listen to my question and the three words. Circle one word, then say the word in a short message.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	If you want someone to help you, which polite word could you say? Read with me: please, hello, sorry. Which word would you use?	please
b	When you put things into groups, which school word fits? Read with me: compare, sort, habitat. Which word would you use?	sort
c	When you talk about the place an animal lives, which science word fits? Read with me: shelter, weather, habitat. Which word would you use?	habitat

PART 2 • DRAW LINES

SAY “I will read the words in both columns. Which word on the right goes with each word on the left? Draw a line for each pair.”
