HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each source aloud twice, then read the choices aloud. Students use details from both sources to answer a question, then copy their circled findings to communicate accurate facts.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • FIND FACTS

SAY “What question are we researching first? Listen to both sources, then listen to the choices. Which word answers each question? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Our first question is, “How does a honey bee move?” Source one is a book: “A honey bee has wings on its body.” Source two is a video: “The bee goes through the air from one flower to the next.” Read the choices with me: fly, crawl, dig. Which word answers our question? Circle it.	fly
b	Our next question is, “Where does a honey bee live with many other honey bees?” Source one is a book: “Many honey bees stay together in a covered place with small wax rooms.” Source two is a video: “Bees enter and leave one small opening in their shared home.” Read the choices with me: hive, pond, cave. Which word answers our question? Circle it.	hive

PART 2 • SHARE FACTS

SAY “Look at the words you circled. Which circled word belongs with move, and which circled word belongs with home? Write each word in its matching box.”

- Box 1 (beside move): **fly**
- Box 2 (beside home): **hive**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle fly in the first row and hive in the second row. Accept legible copying of fly and hive in the matching boxes, including developmentally appropriate letter formation.
