HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud and have students say the tens and ones before they mark or write. Students show the skill by choosing or writing a number only when both its tens digit and ones digit match the amounts named.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “A two-digit number has a tens digit and an ones digit. In 52, the 5 means 5 tens, and the 2 means 2 ones. Listen to each row, say the tens and ones, then circle your choice.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The choices are 46, 64, and 44. Which number has 4 tens and 6 ones? Circle it.	46
b	The choices are 71, 17, and 77. Which number has 1 ten and 7 ones? Circle it.	17
c	The choices are 29, 92, and 22. Which number has 2 tens and 9 ones? Circle it.	29

PART 2 • WRITE IT

SAY “The letter T means tens, and the letter O means ones. The label 5T2O means 5 tens and 2 ones. For each label, tell how many tens and how many ones, then write the two-digit number in the box.”

- Box 1 (beside 6T3O): **63**
- Box 2 (beside 1T8O): **18**
- Box 3 (beside 9T4O): **94**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are 46, 17, and 29. Accept 63, 18, and 94 in the writing boxes, and listen for students to name both the tens and the ones for each number.
