SPOT THE RULE

A multiplication pattern may show equal groups added again and again, such as counting by the same number. Another multiplication pattern may multiply each term by the same factor, so the amounts added do not have to stay the same. Find the rule between terms, then use it to extend the pattern or predict a later term.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Extend the pattern: 6, 12, 18, ____, ____.

1. $6 + 6 = 12$.

2. $12 + 6 = 18$.

3. $18 + 6 = 24$.

4. $24 + 6 = 30$.

Answer: 24, 30

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **63 stars** The pattern adds 7 stars for each quiz. Multiply 9 by 7 to get 63.
2. **40 badges** The badge totals increase by 5 for each book. Multiply 8 by 5 to get 40.

CHALLENGE

32, 64. Each term is multiplied by 2, so 16 multiplied by 2 is 32 and 32 multiplied by 2 is 64.

Accept equivalent rule descriptions, such as “count back by 4” for subtract 4. For the challenge, accept an explanation that identifies multiplying by 2, even if the student uses different words.
