KEEP NUMBERS MEANINGFUL

Decide what the numbers describe before you calculate. Write an equation, label your answer with a unit, and use an estimate or a related fact to check whether your answer makes sense.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A museum has 24 postcards. It puts 6 postcards in each packet. How many packets does it make?

1. The total is 24 postcards, with 6 postcards in each packet.
2. Divide: $24 \div 6 = 4$.
3. Check: $6 \times 4 = 24$.

Answer: 4 packets

Maya says that $312 - 158$ is about 200 because $300 - 100 = 200$. Is her estimate reasonable? Find the exact difference and explain with a better estimate.

#	PROBLEM	ANSWER
1	The library has 35 new books. It puts 5 books on each display shelf. How many shelves does it use? Write a division equation. Then check by multiplying.	7 shelves; $35 \div 5 = 7$, and $7 \times 5 = 35$.
2	At a game event, 8 players each earn 12 tokens. How many tokens do they earn altogether? Estimate first, then write a multiplication equation.	96 tokens; estimate: $8 \times 10 = 80$, so 96 is reasonable. Equation: $8 \times 12 = 96$.
3	A pet shelter shares 63 cans of food equally among 9 cats. How many cans does each cat get? Write an equation and a multiplication check.	7 cans per cat; $63 \div 9 = 7$, and $9 \times 7 = 63$.
4	A coach puts 72 grapes equally into 8 snack cups. How many grapes are in each cup? Explain why your answer is reasonable using a related multiplication fact.	9 grapes per cup; $72 \div 8 = 9$, and $8 \times 9 = 72$.
5	Each skate pass costs \$3. Jalen buys 14 skate passes for his group. How much does he spend? Use an estimate to check your total.	\$42; $14 \times 3 = 42$. An estimate of $15 \times 3 = 45$ shows \$42 is reasonable.
6	A craft club uses 96 beads to make bracelets. Each bracelet needs 12 beads. How many bracelets can the club make? Write a division equation and check it.	8 bracelets; $96 \div 12 = 8$, and $12 \times 8 = 96$.

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 73 batteries** $291 - 218 = 73$. An estimate is $290 - 220 = 70$, so 73 more batteries is reasonable; $218 + 73 = 291$ also checks the answer exactly.
- 169 chairs** $11 \times 13 = 143$, and $143 + 26 = 169$. Estimating $10 \times 15 = 150$ and then $150 + 30 = 180$ shows that 169 is reasonable.

CHALLENGE

No. 312 - 158 = 154. Rounding to tens gives $310 - 160 = 150$, so 154 is reasonable, not 200.

Accept multiplication equations written in either factor order and equivalent, sensible estimate checks. For the robotics problem, the response must state why 73 is reasonable, such as $290 - 220$ is about 70, and may also check by addition.
