CHOOSE THE OPERATION

To change from a larger unit to a smaller unit, multiply. To change from a smaller unit to a larger unit, divide. Use a conversion fact to decide how many of the new units equal the unit you started with.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Convert 7 feet to inches.

1. 1 foot = 12 inches.

2. $7 \times 12 = 84$.

3. 7 feet = 84 inches.

Answer: 84 inches

CHALLENGE

A drink cooler holds 2 gallons and 6 cups of water. Is that more or less than 10 quarts? Tell how many cups more or less.

1. **44 cups** There are 4 cups in 1 quart. Multiply 11×4 to get 44 cups.
2. **208 ounces** There are 16 ounces in 1 pound. Multiply 13×16 to get 208 ounces.

It is 2 cups less than 10 quarts.
