BUILD AN ARGUMENT

To test a claim, write an equation that matches the story, solve it, and check your result. State whether the claim is correct, then use your equation as evidence.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A reader has 54 pages left in a book and reads 6 pages each day. Jordan says the book will take 8 days to finish. Is Jordan correct?

1. Write $54 \div 6$.
2. Divide: $54 \div 6 = 9$.
3. Check: $9 \times 6 = 54$.

Answer: No. The book will take 9 days.

CHALLENGE

A shelter has 12 rooms with 14 kittens in each room. After 39 kittens are adopted, Kim writes $12 \times (14 - 39)$. Omar writes $(12 \times 14) - 39$. Which argument is viable? Explain why.

#	PROBLEM	ANSWER
1	A pet shop puts 56 treats equally into 7 bags. Eli says each bag gets 7 treats. Is Eli correct? Write an equation and a sentence.	No. $56 \div 7 = 8$, so each bag gets 8 treats.
2	The art club sets out 8 tables with 13 seats at each table. Sam says there are 104 seats. Is Sam correct? Show an equation.	Yes. $8 \times 13 = 104$ seats.
3	A smoothie recipe uses $\frac{2}{3}$ cup of fruit for each pitcher. Priya makes 3 pitchers and says she needs 2 cups of fruit. Do you agree?	Yes. $3 \times \frac{2}{3} = 2$, so she needs 2 cups.
4	A player has 75 game points and loses 28 points. Mateo says the player has 57 points left. Is Mateo correct?	No. $75 - 28 = 47$, so the player has 47 points left.
5	Two notebooks cost \$4.25 each. Nia says the total cost is \$8.00. Is her claim correct?	No. $2 \times \\$4.25 = \\8.50.

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- Yes. They sell 199 key chains.** $11 \times 16 = 176$. Then $176 + 23 = 199$.
- No. 48 tokens remain.** $\frac{3}{5}$ of 180 is 108, and $180 - 108 = 72$. Then $72 - 24 = 48$.

CHALLENGE

Omar's argument is viable. $12 \times 14 = 168$, and $168 - 39 = 129$ kittens remain. Kim subtracts 39 from each room instead of from the total.

Accept equivalent equations and clear written evidence. Students should state whether each claim is correct and connect their conclusion to accurate calculations.
