Students ask a sky question and sort objects into day, night, or both.

HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each choice and question aloud. Students say the sorting question aloud, then classify sky objects as seen in the day sky, night sky, or both by circling and matching.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “For each row, point to each word as I read it. Ask with me, “Do we see it in the day sky, night sky, or both?” Then listen to the row question and circle one word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Which word names something we see in the day sky but not the night sky? The words are Star, Moon, and Sun. What will you circle?	Sun
b	Which word names something we see in the night sky but not the day sky? The words are Sun, Star, and Moon. What will you circle?	Star
c	Which word names something we can see in both the day sky and the night sky? The words are Star, Moon, and Sun. What will you circle?	Moon

PART 2 • SORT LINES

SAY “Point to each word on the left as I read it. Ask, “Is it seen in the day sky, night sky, or both?” Draw a line from each sky word to its matching sky-time word.”

- **Sun** matches **DAY**
- **Moon** matches **BOTH**
- **Star** matches **NIGHT**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle rows: 1. Sun, 2. Star, 3. Moon. Match Sun to DAY, Moon to BOTH, and Star to NIGHT.
