Market Day Sources

- ① On Saturday, Maya helped at River Town Market. Her neighbor brought jars of honey from hives on his farm just outside town. A baker on Main Street delivered warm bread. These goods were made locally, close to the people who bought them. Making and selling local goods can support workers and businesses in the community.
- ② Other market goods came from elsewhere in the United States. A company in Michigan made bottles of red apple juice. A factory in North Carolina made cotton T-shirts for the market helpers. Michigan and North Carolina are part of the same country as River Town, but they are far from Maya's community. Trucks carried these goods to the market.
- ③ Some goods began in other countries. The market sold bananas grown in Ecuador and cocoa powder made in Ghana. Ships, planes, or trucks can move goods across long distances before they reach a store. Maya read each package label to learn where a good was made or grown. The labels helped her sort goods by where they came from.
