Finding Mountain Ranges

- ① The United States has many mountain ranges. This passage focuses on two major ranges, the Appalachian Mountains and the Rocky Mountains. A mountain range is a long chain of mountains. To locate a range, look for direction words and nearby places. These clues help you tell whether a range is in the eastern, central, or western part of the country.
- ② The Appalachian Mountains lie in the eastern United States. They stretch from northeastern states southward toward Alabama. These older mountains are closer to the Atlantic Ocean than the Rocky Mountains are. If you travel west from the Atlantic coast across many eastern states, you can reach the Appalachians. Their hills and forests cross several state borders.
- ③ The Rocky Mountains are in the western United States. They run from northern states southward into New Mexico. The Rockies stand much farther west than the Appalachians. A traveler going west across the country would reach the Appalachians first and the Rockies later. Knowing east and west helps you place both ranges in the correct part of the United States.
