HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each short situation and each choice word aloud, then give children time to circle. Students show civic understanding when they connect a kind or responsible choice to a character-trait word.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • GOOD CHOICES

SAY “Look at the three big words in each row. I will read the words and tell you about a choice. Circle the word that names the good-citizen trait in each story.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The words are HONESTY, COURTESY, and SELF-CONTROL. You knock over a block tower, and you tell what happened. Which word names this choice? Circle it.	HONESTY
b	The words are SELF-CONTROL, COURTESY, and HONESTY. You say please when you ask the lunch helper for milk. Which word names this choice? Circle it.	COURTESY
c	The words are COURTESY, HONESTY, and SELF-CONTROL. You feel mad, but you take slow breaths and keep your hands still. Which word names this choice? Circle it.	SELF-CONTROL

PART 2 • COMMUNITY CHOICES

SAY “Listen to each story and the three big words in its row. Circle the word that names the good-citizen trait in each story.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The words are RESPECT, PRIDE, and PATRIOTISM. During the Pledge, you stand quietly with your hand over your heart. Which word names this choice? Circle it.	PATRIOTISM
b	The words are RESPECT, PATRIOTISM, and PRIDE. Another child is talking, and you listen without interrupting. Which word names this choice? Circle it.	RESPECT
c	The words are PATRIOTISM, PRIDE, and RESPECT. You see your class work hanging neatly and feel happy about your class. Which word names this feeling? Circle it.	PRIDE

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Accept a clear circle around HONESTY, COURTESY, SELF-CONTROL, PATRIOTISM, RESPECT, and PRIDE, in row order. A child may state the trait aloud instead of reading the printed word independently.
