HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Before the activity, show a clear photo of the Lincoln Memorial from a classroom social studies book. Keep the photo visible while students listen, circle words, and draw lines to connect the important names. Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE WORDS

SAY “Look closely at the photo of the big white building in our class book. I will read the words in each row. Listen to each question, then circle one word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Which name goes with the building in our photo? Circle the word.	Lincoln
b	Which word tells what kind of place this building is? Circle the word.	Memorial
c	Which word begins the holiday name for Abraham Lincoln? Circle the word.	Presidents

PART 2 • DRAW LINES

SAY “Listen as I read the words on the left and the words on the right. Draw a line from each word on the left to the word that makes a name or holiday name with it.”

- **Lincoln** matches **Abraham**
- **Memorial** matches **Lincoln**
- **Presidents** matches **Day**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle Lincoln, Memorial, and Presidents, in that order. Lines should make Abraham Lincoln, Lincoln Memorial, and Presidents Day.
