HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each short situation aloud, then read the large words in the row. Students listen for a baby animal's signal or a parent action that helps the baby. For a different example, a duckling may peep in the rain, and its parent may lead it to shelter.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • PARENT HELPS

SAY “Listen to each animal situation. Then listen to the three parent action words and circle the word that best helps the baby.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A newborn lamb is cold and calls. Which parent action helps the lamb stay warm: feed, warm, or guard?	warm
b	A hungry robin chick cheeps. Which parent action helps the chick get food: warm, guard, or feed?	feed
c	A wolf pup hears danger and whimpers. Which parent action helps keep the pup safe: guard, feed, or warm?	guard

PART 2 • BABY SIGNALS

SAY “Listen to each situation. Then listen to the three signal words and circle the word that names the baby animal's sound.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A hungry baby bird makes a high sound. Its parent hears it and brings food. Which signal word fits: cry, bark, or cheep?	cheep
b	A human baby is upset and calls for a parent. The parent comes to comfort the baby. Which signal word fits: cry, cheep, or bark?	cry
c	A puppy wants its parent nearby. The parent hears the puppy and comes close. Which signal word fits: cheep, bark, or cry?	bark

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Parent Helps answers are warm, feed, guard. Baby Signals answers are cheep, cry, bark. Accept one clearly circled answer per row.
