LOOK FOR EVIDENCE

Energy can move by sound, light, heat, or electric currents.
Look for a change, such as motion, warmth, light, or a sound,
to find evidence of the transfer.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A radio plays after it is plugged into an outlet. What transfers energy to the radio?

1. The radio changes by making sound.
2. It is connected to an outlet.
3. An electric current transfers energy to the radio.

Answer: electric current

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **sound** The speaker makes sound, and the ribbon moves. The motion is evidence that sound transferred energy to the ribbon.
2. **light** Sunlight reaches the cup, and the drink warms. The warming is evidence that light transferred energy.

CHALLENGE

Electric current transfers energy from the battery to the motor, shown by spinning. Sound transfers energy from the motor, shown by the hum. Heat transfers energy from the warm shaft to a finger.

Accept "electrical energy" for "electric current." Accept equivalent evidence statements that correctly connect the observed change to the named energy transfer.
