Buzzing Neighbors

- ① Bees visit flowers to collect nectar and pollen. They help many plants make seeds and fruit. This short guide teaches you how to watch bees safely, so you can enjoy seeing them without bothering them.
- ② First, use your eyes, not your hands. Stand a few steps away from a bee on a flower. If a bee flies close, stay still or walk away slowly. Fast waving can make a bee feel threatened.
- ③ **Bee Watch:** Let bees have space. Watch from a path or a bench instead of leaning over flowers. Tell a grown-up if you find a bee nest near a busy play area. A grown-up can get help safely.

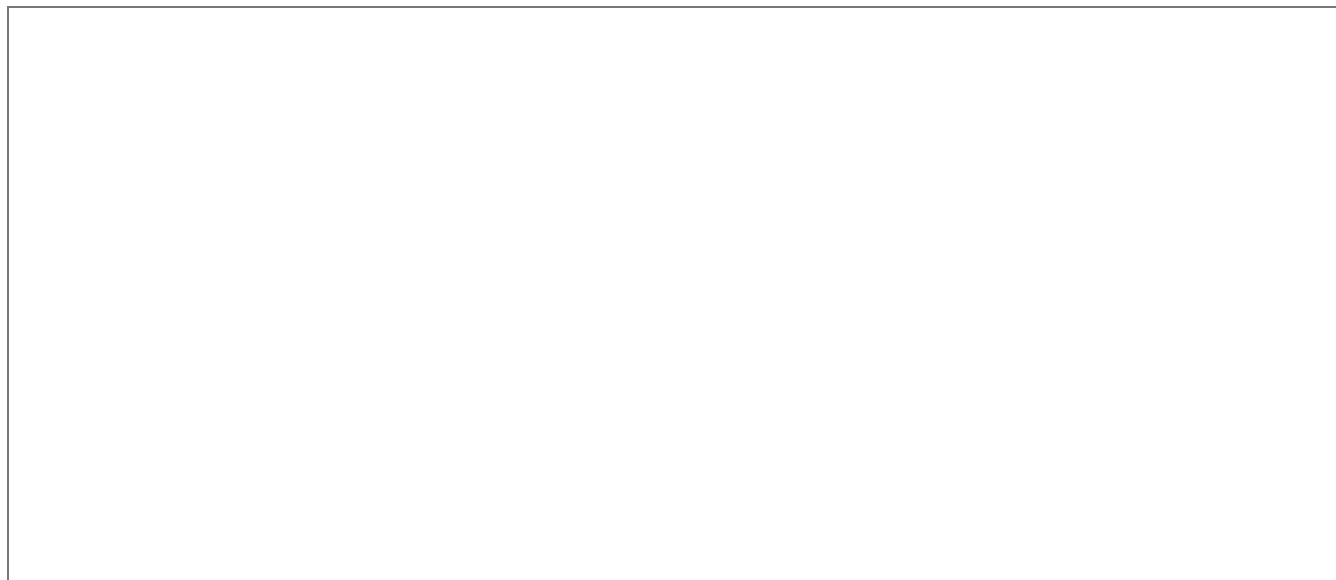
