Back on the Shelf

- ① On Tuesday, Mia returned a book about frogs to the town library. At the desk, Ms. Chen scanned the book's label. The computer showed that the book was back. Mia placed it on a rolling cart with other returned books.
- ② In a workroom, workers checked each book. They looked for torn pages or marks. Then they sorted the books by where they belonged. A book about frogs went with other science books, not with storybooks.
