Maya's Lunch Waste Talk

- ① Maya gave a short presentation about lunch waste at her school. She wanted her audience to notice that Thursday had the most waste. Instead of only saying the numbers, Maya showed a bar graph from her class's four-day waste check. The tallest bar made Thursday's amount easy to spot.

- ② Next, Maya showed one close-up photo of a tray with unopened milk cartons and whole apples. She said, “These foods were thrown away.” The photo helped the audience picture the waste. Maya did not add many photos, because too many pictures could pull attention away from her main fact.
- ③ At the end, Maya used a final slide with three large words: “Take what you will eat.” She also included a small drawing of a lunch tray. The short message told the audience what to do. The drawing matched her topic without covering the important words during her last sentence.
